Health – Health (also spelled healths, healthy, heath or heaths) is an important concept in medicine, public health, and military science. It is the state of being in good health or well-being, health is a fundamental aspect of human and animal well-being, and of the good functioning of the biosphere as a whole. The body's ability to function is referred to as health, the opposite of health is illness, disorder, dysfunction, or incapacity. Health is broadly seen as a state of complete physical, mental, and social well-being and not merely the absence of disease or infirmity. Health can also be defined by the World Health Organization as "the state of complete physical, mental and social well-being and not merely the absence of disease or infirmity." 1. Medical terminology – Medical terminology is the vocabulary used by doctors, nurses, pharmacists, other health care providers and researchers in the field of medicine and allied health. Medical terminology has been developed as a language for communicating the language used by physicians and other health care providers and researchers. When physicians and other health care providers use medical terminology, the term applies to the language used in describing medical conditions, to the description of the physical aspects of the body, to the processes used in diagnosis and treatment. The term also includes the terminology used by researchers in the study of medicine, the term is also used to describe the language used to describe communication, such as in telephone support lines. Medical terminology is developed and studied by medical professional associations such as the International Classification of Diseases, the Terminologia Giovanni, the Latin terminology is now being developed by the International Society for Disease Control. Modern medical vocabulary is concerned with practical matters such as the classification of disease and the standard language used in documentation. The most common standardized vocabulary used in medical research are controlled medical vocabularies, medical terminology is a part of medical practice. The way doctors, nurses, pharmacists, and other health care providers use medical terminology varies by country, discipline, training, medical terminology is sometimes taught as part of medical or nursing school curriculum. However, there is a wide variety in medical terminology training worldwide. Some medical schools and training programs have medical terminology courses, medical terminology is also taught at various undergraduate and post-graduate levels, in various medical disciplines, by various organizations.
