Ohio Valley of the Imagination Before he was known as “The Prince of Punk,” Green Day front man Billie Joe Armstrong was born Billy Joe Armstrong in the eponymous hometown of Cincinnati, Ohio, in 1976. Beginning his band, The Offspring, in 1989, Armstrong made his way to the guitar-oriented hardcore of the Northeast and then to Los Angeles, a city where he could explore and grow as an artist. Inspired by that city, he made the decision to study film at New York University. While studying, he recorded his first EP, which he released under the name Billie Bombshell. The EP sold over 1,000 copies, and was not released officially until four years later, when he became known as Green Day. Shortly after signing a deal with Capitol Records, the group recorded their debut album, *Kerplunk*, released in 1991. Following its release, Green Day toured for the next four years, playing a mixture of sold-out shows, college tours, and smaller clubs. In 1997, after the band had been signed with Columbia Records, they released *Dookie*, which generated sales of over eight million copies. By then, Green Day had become big stars in the mainstream music industry, but Armstrong felt that they could reach even greater heights, and to do so, they needed to remain independent. The band broke off from their label in 1998 to release *American Idiot*, which

also went on to sell over eight million copies. Over the next decade, Green Day toured and released more albums, including Kerplunk (2008), which they recorded during a 10-week writing session at their home in Oakland. The album proved to be a success for the band, who completed their 13th studio album, ¡Uno!, in November 2015, a record produced entirely by touring member, Rob Cavallo. Joe Pujol Joe Pujol (born in Naples, Italy) is an American/Italian researcher of forensic genetics at the University of California, Berkeley, and the president and founder of Forensic Science International, Inc. Pujol was born in Italy to a family of Sicilian extraction. After graduating from high school in Italy, he received his BA in chemistry from the University of Florence in 1978. He received his Ph.D. in genetics at the University of Naples Federico II, where he studied the role of genes in human diseases. His involvement with the science of forensic genetics began while he was completing his Ph.D. program. He is an Associate Professor of Genetics at the University of California, Berkeley, and serves as Director of the Institute of Genetics and Molecular Medicine (IGMM) at the University of California, Berkeley. He also directs the Forensic Science International, Inc., (FSI) research laboratory, a genetics/genomics laboratory and a forensic genetics unit of FSI. Pujol was recognized in 1991 for his pioneering work on the use of deoxyribonucleic acid (DNA) for forensic purposes. Pujol coined the term forensic genetics. He was the first to apply such methods to the study of human ancestry. Pujol is the author of several books, including *A Genetic View of Human* 2d92ce491b
