An undated version of the film was included in a trailer for Tomorrowland, released in June 2014. A version of the film with mono audio and a new opening credits sequence in English was also released through Disney Digital 3D. The new version, which

included pre-rendered sequences in 3D, was released in the United Kingdom on October 16, 2014.

Two copies of the film were released on Blu-ray: the original edition, released on November 2, 2014, and a Special Edition released on June 22, 2015.

Reception On review aggregator website Rotten Tomatoes, 30 Minutes or Less has an approval rating of 86% based on, with an average rating of 6.9/10. The website's critical consensus reads: "Shrewd satire of modern culture

keeps the laughs coming throughout this slight movie, and perfectly skewers Hollywood's mindless treatment of action stars." On Metacritic, the film has a score of 53 out of 100 based on, indicating "mixed or average reviews". USA Today rated the film 2/4 stars, writing, "This is a sometimes clever and sometimes boneheaded satire that, despite occasional laughs, never gets going." Richard Roeper gave the film a 2/4 star rating saying it "is a watchable train wreck, and often

really funny. The writing is often really funny, the acting is often really funny, and it's got a very unique visual style. Unfortunately, it's not enough for a crowd that is largely made up of people who missed out on the crazy cultural boom of the 1980s." Roger Ebert, who met Clarke and Day at the 2012 Sundance Film Festival, gave the film 3/4 stars, writing, "This is a wild ride, and I give it three stars. It has a tendency to go a little too far, to make a joke that's too broad and that can't possibly live up to

the joke being made, but overall, it's a very exciting movie." Box office The film opened #3 at the North American box office, behind The Hunger Games and John Carter. Its US \$8.6 million opening was the smallest of the three films. The film eventually grossed \$17.5 million at the U.S. box office and \$28.4 million internationally, for a worldwide total of \$45.9 million.
