London Luton airport

LLA opens 16 July 1938 during World War 2. Fighter planes utilize almost all airports. After the war, they relocated to <u>Luton</u> and built a sperate airport for civilian and military. Luton Airport remained London's fourth largest airport in 2015 and ranked fifth among the UK's busiest. Luton Airport handles all airline bookings and scheduled departures to Europe and other nations.



Aircraft movements at Luton Airport:

Luton airport handled a total of 63,593 aircraft movements during 2020, an decrease of 55% compared to 2019. An aircraft movement is the takeoff or landing of any aircraft from the airport.



Travelers record:

In 2020, Luton airport served a total of 5,472,786 passengers; 5,457,201 on scheduled flights (99.7%) and 15,585 on charter flights (0.3%). This is a drop of 69.6% in passengers compared to 2019.
